Subject: Display of the United Nations Flag on the United Nations Day - reg.

Every year 24th October is observed as the United Nations Day. On this day, the United Nations Flag is flown along with the National Flag on all buildings on which the Indian National Flag is regularly flown. The United Nations Flag is, however, <u>not</u> flown on Rashtrapati Bhawan, Vice-President's House, Parliament House and Supreme Court building.

- 2. In terms of para 3.36 of the Flag Code of India, 2002, "When the United Nation's Flag is flown along with the National Flag, it can be displayed on either side of the National Flag. The general practice is to fly the National Flag on the extreme right with reference to the direction which it is facing (i.e. extreme left of an observer facing the masts flying the Flags)."
- 3. The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs is requested to issue suitable instructions in the matter in so far as the buildings under their charge in Delhi / New Delhi are concerned.

Sir/Madam.

Every year 24th October is observed as the United Nations Day. On this day, the United Nations Flag is flown along with the Indian National Flag on all buildings on which the Indian National Flag is regularly flown. The United Nations Flag is, however, <u>not</u> flown on Raj Bhawans/Raj Niwases and buildings housing Legislative Councils, Legislative Assemblies and High Courts.

- 2. In terms of para 3.36 of the Flag Code of India, 2002, "When the United Nation's Flag is flown along with the National Flag, it can be displayed on either side of the National Flag. The general practice is to fly the National Flag on the extreme right with reference to the direction which it is facing (i.e. extreme left of an observer facing the masts flying the Flags)."
- 3. The State Governments/Union Territory Administrations are requested to issue necessary instructions in the matter accordingly.
